Little acorns Timeless treasures



A sweet little acorn appliqué in two sizes — Mini and Tiny. Perfect for embellishing baby booties, hats, scarves, blankets, or any autumn project. Quick to make, stash-buster friendly, and great for beginners.

## Difficulty level



#### Advanced Beginner

Ideal for those comfortable with basic stitches.

Not essential – size varies depending on yarn and hook choice.

# Recommended yarn

#### Mini Acorn Appliqué

- <u>Baby Bee Sweet Delight</u> Sand
   Castle (lightweight #3 yarn, body)
- <u>Baby Bee Sweet Delight</u> Chocolate (lightweight #3 yarn, cap)

#### Tiny Acorn Appliqué

- <u>DMC Embroidery Floss #842</u> (Beaver Gray – Very Light, beigetan, body)
- <u>DMC Embroidery Floss #938</u>
   (Ultra Dark Coffee Brown, cap)

# Yardage requirements

\*provided requirements are estimates only

- Mini Appliqué (yarn version): Each color uses less than 1 yard (1 m) of yarn
- Tiny Appliqué (floss version): Each color uses less than 1 yard (1 m) of embroidery floss.

Perfect stash-buster project!

## Yarn alternatives

#### For the Body (light brown/taupe):

- Bernat Softee Baby (Linen)
- <u>Lion Brand Coboo</u> (Taupe)
- Red Heart Soft Baby Steps (Beige)

#### For the cap (dark brown):

- <u>Paintbox Yarns Cotton DK</u> (Coffee Bean)
- Scheepjes Softfun (Dark Brown)
- Lion Brand Coboo (Espresso)





## Other Materials

• Crochet hooks:

Mini

- E/4 (3.5 mm) for body
- <u>C/2 (2.75 mm)</u> for cap

Tiny

- <u>5/1.90 mm steel hook</u> (or smaller)
- Scissors
- <u>Tapestry needle</u> for weaving in ends



## Abbreviations

Pattern is written in Standard US crochet terms

\*Click on abbreviation names for tutorials - if viewing digitally

- Stitch / es (st / sts)
- Round / s (rnd /rnds)
- Slip stitch (slp-st)
- Chain stitch (ch / chs)
- Single crochet (sc)
- Half double crochet (hdc)
- Double crochet (dc)
- Magic ring (MR)

#### Special Stitches & Techniques:

magic ring/circle - A technique used to begin projects worked in the round. Form a loop with the yarn, crochet the first stitches into the loop. Then pull the tail to close the center tightly, creating a neater, adjustable starting point with no hole in the middle.



## **Finished Dimensions**

All measurements are approximate and taken flat before use or blocking.

This pattern includes two size options:

- Mini Appliqué: approx. 1.5" (4 cm) tall & approx. 1.25" (3 cm) wide
- Tiny Appliqué: approx. 0.75" (2 cm) tall & approx. 0.5" (1.25 cm) wide

#### How measurements are taken:

- Height is measured from the cap of the acorn cap to the pointed tip of the body.
- Width is measured across the widest part of the cap after the piece is finished.

### Construction & Schematics

This pattern is worked in two sections: body and cap

- Body is crocheted in the round (See image 1).
- Cap is crocheted directly onto the body, then filled in with embroidered back-and-forth "strips" for texture (See images 2-3).

## **Additional Notes**

Read all pattern notes, instructions, and details carefully before you begin. A few extra minutes up front can save you hours of frustration later!

- This acorn crochet appliqué pattern is worked in two parts: the body and the cap.
- The acorn **body** is worked in **continuous rounds** do not join, turn, or chain at the end of each round.
- The cap is crocheted directly onto the body and then filled in with back-and-forth stitches to create a solid, textured finish.
- Use a **stitch marker** to mark the first or last stitch of each round if needed to keep track of placement.
- Because this is an appliqué, exact gauge is not required, but even tension will give the neatest finish.
- Stitch counts are shown in brackets [] at the end of each round.
- Care Instructions: Hand wash and lay flat to dry or follow instructions on the yarn label.



# MINI ACORN APPLIQUÉ INSTRUCTIONS





#### **Acorn Body**

With E/4 (3.5 mm) hook & Baby Bee Sweet Delight – Sand Castle for Mini, OR with 1.90 mm steel hook & DMC Embroidery Floss #842 for Tiny.

MR, work 5 sc into ring. [5 sts]

Rnd 1: Ch 1, 2 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, (hdc, dc, hdc) in next st, 2 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, sl-st in initial ch-1 to close. [11 sts]

Fasten off and weave in tail.

#### Acorn Cap

With C/2 (2.75 mm) hook & Baby Bee Sweet Delight – Chocolate for Mini, OR with 1.90 mm steel hook & dark brown embroidery floss for Tiny

Attach yarn with sl st to 2nd sc on the right side of the center sl st that closed Rnd 1.



**Image 4** Attach yarn

- Sc in the same st
- Work 2 hdc sts in the next st

Skip the slp-st that closed Rnd 1, work (2 hdc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 2 hdc) in the next st.

**Note:** The ch 2 and slp-st into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook creates the peak of the acorn cap

Slp-st in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook to complete peak

- Work 2 hdc sts in the next st
- Work one sc and one slp-st into the next st

Cut yarn leaving at least an 18 - inch tail. Thread tail with tapestry needle and sew short "strips" back and forth across the acorn cap to fill in and create a textured cap.

Bind off and weave in ends.
